Buffalo Sunday Morning Worship Services New Starting Time?

At the March meeting the Administrative Board considered moving the starting time for our Sunday morning services from 8:45 to 9:00 a.m. Several members felt the later starting time might help attract new members.

The proposal before the Board is to begin a trial run on May 1 and continue for four months (May-August). A vote on whether to proceed with the new starting time would occur at the next Board meeting in April.

A Letter in Support of the United Methodist Church

When the United Methodist Church postponed the General Conference scheduled for later this year, several Methodist clergy and congregations announced that they had decided to proceed with their plans to initiate a new denomination, titled the Global Methodist Church. The driving motivation behind this new denomination is to resist the full inclusion of LGBTQIA individuals in the life of the church. More than 275 General Conference delegates and other church leaders (including 22 clergy and lay leaders from Iowa) released an open letter March 18 expressing their belief in the UMC's future and their commitment to remain with the denomination. Copied below are excerpts from that letter.

"God will command his angels to protect you wherever you go." Psalm 91:11

Dear Friends in Christ,

We greet you in the loving name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We recognize that the recent postponement of the General Conference may leave some with feelings of powerlessness, abandonment, and anxiety. We hold our entire church in our hearts and prayers and commit to healing the wounds that have been caused by our division.

- We hold in our hearts our LGBTQIA siblings and commit to the celebration and welcome of all God's children, now.
- We commit to prayerfully and steadfastly dismantling the sins of racism, tribalism and colonialism.
- We envision and will work toward a church that is regional in structure, where United Methodists in Africa, Europe, the Philippines and North America can do ministry based on their own cultural context.
- We commit to practicing Wesley's advice—"Though we cannot think alike, may we not love alike?" Recognizing the theological and cultural diversity in our church, we commit to moving forward with a focus on the ministry that unites us. . . .

We join our voices with our bishops to confirm that we are "...one people, rooted in Scripture, centered in Christ, serving in love and united in the essentials." As they noted, our United Methodist Church was founded on a Wesleyan theology of grace and the witness of Jesus Christ. Guided by the Scriptures, we are a people empowered and emboldened by the Holy Spirit.

As we do the work and ministry ahead, we will hold onto our identity as a people of God committed to making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. We will work toward making sure that all feel they belong and are loved in our church. We will continue to claim our place as a powerful connection, with more than 12 million members worldwide, carrying out the mission of God, empowered by the Holy Spirit. And, we will continue to be a church where people can have a deeply personal and communal experience of our triune God.

With so many possibilities facing our beloved denomination, we pray that this letter finds you well. We look forward to a bright and exciting future together.

Issues Addressed at the March Administrative Board Meeting

- In her Trustees Report, Becky Durand reported that Hawkeye Fire and Safety replaced some fire extinguishers during their inspection. Becky will contact the local fire department to set up an inspection time and to determine if we need smoke detectors in the sanctuary and group meeting room.
- The Board approved the repair and maintenance costs for the church's lawn mower. Although 8 years old, it is still in good shape and should provide us many years of reliable service.
- The Board requested Becky to investigate the cost of new chips and landscape timbers for the playground and to locate a vendor for cleaning the church carpets and the floor in the fellowship hall.
- There may be some asbestos that will need removal in the furnace room. Gary Hackney will obtain cost estimates from professionals with the equipment and skills to do this work.
- The Board approved hiring Todd Tompkins to design and construct a 20" x 30" walnut memorial plaque to honor past members of the congregation.
- The Board discussed the issue of Board membership. All members of the congregation are welcome to participate in Board meetings, but it was felt we should have written guidelines to specify the voting Board members. Chair Margie Marrs agreed to do some further research on this matter and at the April meeting will propose a set of guidelines for determining Board membership and voting privileges.


United Women in Faith
