New Pew Bibles

Thanks to a recent sale at Cokesbury Publishing, Buffalo was able to obtain fifty new copies of the Common English translation of the Bible. Forty of these copies have now been distributed among the pews in the worship center, making it possible for everyone both to hear and see the scripture during our worship services.

The Common English Bible (CEB) is not an updated version of an older translation but rather a new translation that attempts to be at a "comfortable reading level" for the majority of English readers. The translation was begun in 2008 by over 120 scholars from 24 different denominations (including Reform Judaism) and completed in 2011. This project was funded by an alliance of several denominations, including the Presbyterian Church, the Episcopal Church, the United Church of Christ, and the United Methodist Church.

Administrative Board Meeting

The Board made several scheduling decisions at the July 21 meeting:

• Coffee after church will resume Sunday, July 25.

• The Neighborhood Pot Lucks will resume on Thursday, September 9 at 11:30 am. Everyone is welcome; please invite your friends and neighbors to join us as we take one more step in renewing this important church program.

• Linn Community Food Bank. Pastor Carol has challenged the congregation to donate a minimum of 100 regular-size cans of soup (preferably tomato or chicken noodle). The donated soup needs to be at the church by Sunday morning, September 26.

• The 2021 Buffalo Fall Bazaar has been scheduled for Saturday, October 23. This popular fund-raising event will include a soup lunch and the selling of baked goods, crafts, white elephants, and our famous homemade noodles.

Buffalo's 145th Anniversary Celebration Schedule Details

The last week in July we will begin distributing fliers advertising our big celebration on August 14-15. Please help us spread the word by signing up to cover all the streets in the Buffalo neighborhood.

The B145 Committee will meet at 9:30 am on Tuesday morning, August 10. We will walk through the weekend schedule and make sure we have all t's crossed, all I's dotted. Please join us in the meeting room for our final planning session.

The Saturday night camp meeting and hymn sing will be held outside, in front of the Hahn Memorial Sculpture. Feel free to bring your own folding chairs or whatever you wish to use during the hour-long service. The program will include an opportunity to sing some of our favorite old-time hymns and be followed by summer-time refreshments (e.g., lemonade and cookies).

The Sunday morning worship service will begin at 10:30 a.m. Our guest speaker with be Rev. Paul Akin. For many years he was the pastor at Lovely Lane and prior to his retirement was at First Methodist in

The catered lunch will be from Nelson's Meat Market and Deli. The menu includes a sloppy joe mix (with Buffalo meat), potato salad, baked beans, various salads and salad dressings, condiments, drinks, and dessert. After the lunch there will be a group photo by a professional photographer from the Quad Cities.

The dedication of the Buffalo Labyrinth and the service in memory of Buffalo members and friends of the congregation will begin at 2:00 pm. The labyrinth is already open and available for anyone who wants to use the site for meditation and prayer. Prior to the dedication, a formal entrance, a structure for holding wind chimes, and three benches will be installed. Brass name plates will be placed on the benches in memory of the people being honored with the Labyrinth memorial.
