What is the Feast of the Epiphany?

According to Wikipedia, Epiphany, also known as Theophany in Eastern Christian traditions, is a Christian feast day that celebrates the revelation of God incarnate as Jesus Christ. In Western Christianity, the feast commemorates the visit of the Magi to the Christ Child, and thus Jesus Christ's physical manifestation to the Gentiles. It is sometimes called Three Kings' Day, and in some traditions celebrated as Little Christmas. In some denominations, the feast of the Epiphany initiates the liturgical season of Epiphanytide. The traditional date for the feast is January 6.
