The following issues were addressed at the February meeting:

•Trustees Report: The building passed the 2nd inspection by the fire department. [Note: special thanks to Gary Hackney for correcting some wiring issues in the office area.]

The cost of trimming the oak tree was \$600.

Marlene thanked Tom Ferguson for working on the shed and all he does to help maintain the church.

• Weekly Exercise Class. Pastor Kathryn is talking to Andrea Kelley about a possible 6-10 week program, starting April 1. We would need 6 to 8 participants; classes would be 40-45 minutes long. Andrea would help us get started, and the class would continue with minimal assistance from Andrea. The program might involve chair aerobics and two-pound weights. It may be possible to write a grant for equipment

• The parking sign for the Pastor has been purchased and is ready to be installed come nicer weather.

• The date of the Annual Rummage Sale has been changed to Thursday, June 14 (8 to 5) and Friday, June 15 (8 to 1) because of the election on June 5. We plan to serve hot dogs (and complementary items) at the sale. To avoid a conflict with an event at the Church on Saturday, June 9, items for the sale can be delivered to the church beginning on Sunday, June 10. Because of the Rummage Sale, there will be no Golden Potluck in June.

• Butterflies. Churches are being encouraged to develop butterfly habitat. Bob Marrs will be introducing new plants to the church landscape this spring that should be favorable for butterflies and birds. Last summer, Carla L. planted butterfly favorites around the electronic sign, and many of the native plants in the bioretention cells should appeal to many butterfly species. • Conversations on a Way Forward. On March 10 at Cornell College in Mount Vernon there will be an all-day meeting to discuss the issues of gay marriage and gay clergy in the United Methodist Church. 
