# Issues Addressed at the April Administrative Board Meeting

- The Pancake Breakfast raised \$900 in free-will offerings. The board decided that the donations be divided in half: \$450 to the Catherine McAuley Center and \$450 to Justice for our Neighbors.
- In her Trustees report, Becky reported that the Fire Department visited Buffalo and informed her that the installation of smoke detectors was not necessary for the meeting room or the sanctuary. The board members were informed that the John Deere mower has been serviced and repaired and should "run like a Deere" for many years to come.
- The board approved the payment of a \$50 fee to determine if the furnace room has any asbestos. [This inspection was held, it appears that the floor almost certainly does have asbestos, and a firm was hired to remove the asbestos.]
- The board members spent some time studying passages from the UMC's *Book of Discipline* to clarify board membership and who is eligible to vote. The results of that discussion are provided in the right-hand column on this page.
- The board voted to conduct a four-month experiment with the Sunday morning worship services beginning 15 minutes later at 9:00 a.m.
- The board members raised no objection to members of the church–plus friends and family members–using the church meeting room for playing cards. Nor were any objections raised to people playing bingo at the Neighborhood Potlucks.
- Now that we have a new computer for the electronic message sign, Pastor Carol volunteered to dispose of the old monitor, computer, and keyboard by donating them to a firm that recycles old computer equipment.

# Organizational Structure and Practices of Buffalo's Administrative Board

According to the UMC's *Book of Discipline*, membership in the church's local council (Buffalo's Administrative Board) will be composed of a minimum of eleven persons who represent key responsibilities and ministries within the church. The membership should include but not be limited to the following [individuals currently in each position are identified in brackets]:

- Chair of the church council [Margie Marrs];
- Lay leader [Mary Fredericksen];
- Chair or representative of the pastor/parish relations committee [Bob Marrs];
- Chair or representative of the committee on finance [Chris Gochenouer];
- Chair or representative of the board of trustees [Becky Durand];
- Church treasurer [Judy Hackney];
- Lay member to the annual conference [Mary Fredericksen];
- President or representative of United Methodist Women [Barb Crawford];
- Representatives of United Methodist Men, young adults, and UMC youth [currently not represented];
- Pastor(s) [Pastor Carol Mart]

Since Buffalo lacks representation in several groups designated by the *Book of Discipline* (such as the absence of a United Methodist Men organization), the church identifies individuals to serve as "members-at-large" [Sheryl Arnett & Gloria Clinton]. With regard to the functioning of Buffalo's Administrative Board, the following practices are followed, adhering to guidelines established in the *Discipline*:

- Only individuals who are members of the Buffalo congregation can serve as voting members of the Administrative Board.
- The Pastor is a member of the board but does not vote on matters before the board.
- Although some individuals may have multiple administrative responsibilities, they have only one vote on matters before the board.
- Everyone is welcome to attend and participate in board meetings, but only designated board members can make motions or vote on matters before the board.
- The board members present and voting at any duly announced meeting shall constitute a quorum.
