Public Measure #1 The Proposed Gun Amendment to the Iowa Constitution

"Never point a gun at a person unless you intend to pull the trigger." ~George Gochenouer, Korean War Veteran On this year's ballot is a proposed amendment to the Iowa Constitution requiring that any restrictions of the right to carry a firearm would be "subject to strict scrutiny." The Iowa United Methodist Conference has taken a strong position opposed to this infringement of the right of Iowa citizens to enact reasonable boundaries on the purchase and ownership of firearms. When filling out your ballot, please vote "No" on this constitutional amendment.

This is a candlelight service with silent meditation, private prayer, the reading of scripture, and the singing of hymns. This ecumenical event is an ideal opportunity to invite friends, neighbors, and family members to join with us for a beautiful Advent experience.

Annual Charge Conference in October

Six Buffalo UMC members attended the Annual Charge Conference on Sunday evening, October 16, at St. Paul's UMC. This annual meeting gives general oversight to the church council, reviews and evaluates the mission and ministry of the church, sets salaries for the pastor and staff, and recommends candidates for ordained ministry. Dr. Moody Colorado, Superintendent for the Pictured Rocks District, presided over our October session.

Dr. Colorado asked each church attending this group meeting to share their ministry action plan goals, and it was interesting to hear what other congregations were doing. The minister at St. Paul's provided a handout defining the purpose of the the Iowa UMC Conference Circuits, the Cedar Rapids Metro Circuit Mission and the Cedar Rapids Circuit Vision. The Circuits' primary goal is to improve the collaboration among the churches in our circuit, "to manifest the Kingdom of God and bring hope." One member of Buffalo's congregation quietly suggested that we might best achieve this goal if all the churches joined together to help make noodles for Buffalo's annual fall bazaar.

The baked goods sale money, totaling \$45, was given to the local chapter of NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness). The profit from the sale of noodles and RADA products was \$123.65.
