### **Administrative Board Meeting in September**

Here's a quick summary of issues addressed at the September Board meeting.

- The city of Cedar Rapids is requiring repairs of the sidewalk on the 30<sup>th</sup> Street side of the church. Allowing the city to do the repair work will eliminate the need for the church to arrange a series of inspections. Because the damage to the sidewalk occurred during the cleanup efforts after the derecho, the cost of the repairs can be covered by our insurance payment.
- The electricity to the shed will be paid with the derecho insurance settlement. The Board authorized the Trustees to purchase a garage door opener and lights for the shade.
- The Board approved a schedule for Sunday Worship Service's "noisy offerings" in 2023. The schedule can be found in the right-hand column on this page. The Board considered a schedule of special worship services for 2023, but a final decision on that schedule was postponed until the next Board meeting.
- The Board members discussed the situation with pot holes in the parking lot and requested that Gary Hackney report back on how we might best proceed. Chris Gochenouer volunteered to paint the bench on the south side of the church. The Hackneys have purchased spikes that once installed should make it more difficult for birds to defecate on the windows of the church's worship center.
- The Board authorized the purchase of a new laptop computer for Pastor Carol to assist with her education and pastoral responsibilities.

September 10: Christian Education (Iowa Conference funds to support small groups/classes, camperships, and scholarships for Christian educators)

October 1: World Communion Sunday (support for scholarships and in-service training programs)

November 26: United Methodist Student Day (General Board of Higher Education and Ministry funding of scholarships and student loans)
