Buffalo's Present & Future

At the August Administrative Board meeting, the group discussed the church's current strengths and vision for the future. During the wide-ranging conversation, the following points had wide-spread agreement as a reasonable portrayal of Buffalo and its future:

- The Board members feel we have been and continue to be a welcoming and friendly church involved with the community. As a congregation, our members work effectively with each other.
- We intend to continue in the United Methodist Church tradition.
- Historically we have had a strong commitment to missions, particularly evident in our active United Women in Faith.
- We communicate effectively through the monthly newsletters, electronic sign. church website, telephone tree, and the Joys and Concerns email distributed after each church service. Pastor Carol sends cards to members who are unable to attend church services, and our outreach team sends cards to new visitors.
- We strive to meet the needs of our congregation, including the special needs of "empty nesters."
- We will continue to reach out to the community through monthly meals, the Little Library, Bible studies, and special church services (such as Christmas Eve and Taize Prayer Services).
- Despite our small numbers, we will continue to maintain a full schedule of neighborhood and social events (e.g., Pancake Breakfast, Rummage Sale).
- We look forward to more worship services outdoors and more engagement with our neighbors.
- It is critical that we remain true to our core traditions while finding ways to attract new members.
- We will continue to pray, to listen to God's word, to respond when God calls us.

Midwest Mission Ingathering

Ingathering is a United Women in Faith project that Buffalo has supported for many years. The church board voted to use the August "noisy offering" collection to buy items for the annual Midwest Mission Ingathering kits due November 2022. The August offering collected \$172; however, further financial contributions are still welcome (cash is always appreciated). The Bertram UMC deserves a special thanks for their donation to help with shipping expenses.

The distribution center is an UMCOR cooperating depot and partners with many other nonprofit organizations. The depot ships two to three containers of humanitarian relief each month, domestically and internationally. All the items have been purchased for the School Kits, but we still need the following items for the Personal Dignity Kits:

- 20 adult toothbrushes (one per package)
- 20 bars soap (3-4 oz)
- 20 deodorants (2-3 oz. stick, roll on, or pump)
